ORDINANCE #1264

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER V OF THE
“REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF
THE BOROUGH OF DEAL, 1982”
General Police Regulations**

WHEREAS, on December 22, 2022, Governor Phil Murphy signed into law New Jersey’s comprehensive gun safety legislation A4769/S3214, which includes firearm fee increases to cover the costs of investigation, administration, and processing of permit applications to carry handguns.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Deal, in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey (the “Borough”), established fees for the Police Department as set forth in Chapter V of the Revised General Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Deal has determined that it is in the best interests of the residents of the Borough to update those fees in accordance with the changes to the New Jersey law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Deal, in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, that Chapter V of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Deal is hereby amended as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter V, General Police Regulations, of the “Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Deal, 1982 be and it hereby is amended in the following particulars:

Section 2. Subsection 5-21 Fees for Certain Services Established is amended to read as follows:

15-21.1 Fees for Certain Services Established.

D. Firearm Applicant Fee:

1. Firearms, Identification Card: \$50.00
2. Firearms, Permits to Purchase: \$25.00
4. Firearms, Permit to Carry: \$150.00 and \$50.00 shall be remitted to the Superintendent of State Police to be deposited into the “Victims of Crime Compensation Office Account”.

Section 3. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with the Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication according to law.
